The Parent Involvement Coordinator prepares postcards for the teachers to mail out to the students. These postcards are for positive messages home. They are used to invite parents to conferences and as follow-up to conferences as well. Sandra Sanders (479)292-3353

The school provides a web site that has teacher page links so that parents can easily see a current copy of the teacher's page that will include current information about the class. Parents have the teacher's email address available in order to contact the teacher. Parents can access their students current grades through a web based system. Margie Rutledge (870)446-2223

The school will use the student handbook, school web site, signage at the school entrance, parent meetings, notes home, local and social media to inform parents about the School wide Title 1 Plan and how to receive a copy. The school will host two parent - teacher conferences in order for parents to conference individually with their child's teacher. Planned parent - teacher conferences are planned for the midpoints of both the first and third nine weeks. Teachers make individual arrangements with parents who are unable to attend the after school event. Parents will be provided with a summary of test scores, an explanation of interventions being used to improve academic performance, and teachers will make suggestions as to how parents can assist their child at home. The school will offer parental instruction events in the Fall and Winter including a Science Night, Math Night, Literacy Night, and Title 1 Meeting. During these events, parents will learn about assessments, the Common Core Standards and our school's curriculum, and ways to assist their child in learning. In the Spring, the school will host an Elementary Transition Night to prepare sixth grade students for the transition to High School. At the Elementary Graduation, parents will be invited to take part in a Celebration of Learning. At this time, parents will be asked to reflect upon the year and offer suggestions for improvement of the Parent Involvement Program.
